



Confidentiality of Library Records

The Curry Library, in keeping with the recommendations of the American Library Association, recognizes that circulation records and other records identifying the names of library users are confidential in nature.

Therefore, such records shall not be made available to any agency of state, federal, or local government except pursuant to such process, order or subpoena as may be authorized under the authority of, and pursuant to, federal, state or local law relating to civil, criminal or administrative discovery procedures and legislative power.

The only person who can find out what is checked out on a patron's record is the patron himself/herself. Parents, spouses, children and roommates of patrons do not have the right to find out what library materials a patron has checked out.
